REVIEW OF OPERATING PERFORMANCE FOR THE QUARTER ENDED 30 APRIL 2005 vs QUARTER ENDED 30 APRIL 2004

3QFY05

Group turnover grew 98% year-on-year (y-o-y) to \$68.0 million for the quarter ended 30 April 2005, reflecting the strong demand arising from the marine and oil sector that the Group serves. The Group was able to secure more orders from leading shipyards to supply their requirements for new ship building, repair and maintenance projects.

With a higher inventory carrying cost compared to the previous corresponding period, gross margin for the quarter ended 30 April 2005 had moderated from a high 35% in 3QFY04, to a sustainable level of about 20% in 3QFY05, which was in line with the gross margin achieved in 2QFY05. Nonetheless, the higher trading volume enabled the Group to record a 10% y-o-y improvement in gross profit to \$13.3 million.

Total operating expenses declined 16% y-o-y to \$3.8 million in 3QFY05. Continued efforts by management to rationalize the operations of the Group led to lower staff cost and other operating expenses.

The higher effective tax rate at 22.9% was attributed to underprovision in the previous quarter.

3QFY05 net profit increased 13% over the same period last year.

Nine months ended Apr 2005

Turnover

Group turnover jumped a hefty 133% from \$66.4 million to \$155.0 million for the 9 months ended 30 April 2005. The increase was attributed to continued strong demand, particularly from the booming Marine and Oil sectors. Demand was especially strong in the quarter ended 30 April 2005.

Year-on-year comparison was also boosted by the first full 9 months of contribution by its wholly owned subsidiary, Hoe Seng Huat Pte Ltd, which was acquired in January 2004. This effect had also contributed to the higher expenses incurred in the current period ended 30 April 2005 compared to the corresponding period of the previous financial year.

The increase in the turnover and higher steel prices resulted in the cost of goods sold rising 151% from \$47.3 million to \$118.6 million for the 9 months ended 30 April 2005. Correspondingly, gross profit grew 90% from \$19.2 million to \$36.4 million y-o-y for the 9 months ended 30 April 2005.

Staff cost, Depreciation, Other operating expenses & Finance cost

Staff cost rose 52% to \$8.6 million compared with \$5.6 million of the corresponding period due to higher headcount arising from the enlarged Group and provision for bonus in the light of the better results. Nevertheless, staff cost reduced from \$2.9 million in 3QFY04 to \$2.4 million in 3QFY05 due to continued effort to rationalise operations of the Group.

Net finance cost of \$466,000 were mainly made up of trust receipts interests incurred in the normal course of business compared to \$214,000 of the corresponding period. The increase was largely due to higher working capital funding to support the increase in trading volume.

Other operating expenses rose to \$5.7 million from \$3.1 million due to higher trading volume and accounting for expenses of the new business for the full 9 months for the financial period ended 30 April 2005.

Profitability review

Profit before tax rose nearly 114% to \$21.1 million from \$9.8 million.

In view of the higher profit recorded, provision for tax also rose in tandem from \$1.7 million to \$4.0 million.

REVIEW OF FINANCIAL POSITION AS AT 30 APRIL 2005

Non current assets

In accordance with the revised accounting standard FRS 103 on Business Combination, no amortisation of goodwill has been taken up for the period ended 30 April 2005. No impairment in value was made during the period as the business, from which the goodwill arises, was expected to remain profitable.

Current assets and current liabilities

The Group had a cash and cash equivalents of \$14.2 million for the quarter ended 30 April 2005.

Trade and other receivables rose to \$54.4 million from \$30.0 million as a result of higher turnover reported for the period.

Inventories on hand also increased to \$53.9 million from \$34.1 million in order to fulfill secured orders and in view of the continued demand for steel products.

In line with the higher volume recorded, trade payables increased from \$3.5 million to \$4.0 million while other payables and accruals increased from \$5.4 million to \$5.8 million.

Increase in borrowings was substantially made up of trust receipts incurred during the ordinary course of business and short term bank borrowings. The increase to \$43.7 million from \$9.7 million was due largely to higher working capital funding to support the increase in trading volume.

Non current liabilities

Non current borrowings fell from \$7.9 million to \$1.7 million due to repayment of bank loan.

Share capital and reserves

Share capital increased by \$27k due to the issuance of ordinary shares pursuant to the exercise of the employees' stock options during the year. As a result, share premium account also increased by \$17k for the period ended 30 April 2005.

According to the April industrial growth report by the Straits Times, dated 27 May 2005, there were vigorous activities in the ship repair/building and oil rig fabrication. Hence, the Group expects demand from the Marine and Oil sectors to remain strong. With steel prices expected to remain stable and its abilities to supply structural steel, pipe and fittings' products as a one-stop shop to meet the requirements of the customers, the Group expects to benefit from these opportunities.

The Board of Directors has decided to change the financial year end from July to June with effect from the current financial year. Hence the current financial year will end on 30 June 2005 with 11 months' results.

The Board is pleased to highlight that the results for the last 9 months ended 30 April 2005 had already surpassed those of the last financial year ended 31 July 2004.
